So this memory lives again when I come to the Lord's table and influences my attitude toward the feast. I come as a worker in the harvest though the task is incomplete. I am hot, tired and hungry, and have an itchy irritation from the dust and chaff of the past week. It is a relief when He calls me to His table, and a joy--the coming together, the washing up of the Spirit, and the sitting down to the feast. And I leave His table replenished as in those harvest meals of long ago, eager to finish the harvest, for the stores I gather in are preparation for His greater feast. by my uncle James Lee Jenkins as a communion meditation

I don't remember what I told him that night, but I do remember watching him smear butter and jelly on that ugly burned biscuit. When I got up from the table that evening, I remember hearing my Mom apologize to my dad for burning the biscuits. And I'll never forget what he said: "Honey, I love burned biscuits every now and then." Later that night, I went to kiss Daddy good night and I asked him if he really liked his biscuits burned. He wrapped me in his arms and said, "Your Momma put in a hard day at work today and she's real tired. And besides, a little burned biscuit never hurt anyone!"

As I've grown older, I've thought about that many times. Life is full of imperfect things and imperfect people. I'm not the best at anything, and I forget birthdays and anniversaries just like everyone else... but what I've learned over the years is that learning to accept each other's faults and choosing to celebrate each other's differences, is one of the most important keys to creating a healthy, growing, and lasting relationship. And that's my prayer for you today... that you will learn to take the good, the bad, and the ugly parts of life and lay them at the feet of God. In the end, He's the only One who gives you a relationship where a burnt biscuit isn't a deal-breaker!
